# Welcome to the Minato City Local History Museum

The Minato City Local History Museum, which is housed in a historical building, is a central facility where visitors can learn about, explore and interact with Minato City through its culture, history, and nature. It is a facility designed for everyone to discover the charms of Minato City through permanent and special exhibits, events, a café, and museum gift shop. We hope that all visitors here today enjoy some new experiences and gain illuminating knowledge.

This building, designed by Uchida Yoshikazu, Professor, Department of Architecture at the University of Tokyo, was constructed in1938 as the Institute of Public Health. The architectural structure is steel-reinforced concrete, and the exterior was finished using scratch tiles. Its characteristic design is called "Uchida Gothic", which can also be found at the adjoining Institute of Medical Science, The University of Tokyo. You can see various original design elements that have been retained inside the building, such as the former auditorium, classrooms and laboratories, as well as detailed creative elements. This renovated historic building, which includes the Minato City Local History Museum, hosts a variety of services as a community facility.

The design, with its open ceiling and symmetrical stone staircases, are characteristic of this hall.

This auditorium features terraced seating. Most of the parts have remained exactly as they were when they first opened. The lighting equipment as well as reliefs on the sides of the podium are characteristic.

You can see the high level of the craftsmen's skills from those days in these rooms. In particular, the walls and ceiling are finished using luxurious veneers, and the floor features exquisite parquet in the President's Room.

### Theme1: Dynamism of the Ocean and People 3F

This exhibit is about the history of Minato City as it relates to Tokyo Bay through three themes: environment, shell mounds, and fisheries.


Portion of Historic Edo Map

# Communication Room 2F Free admission


